
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

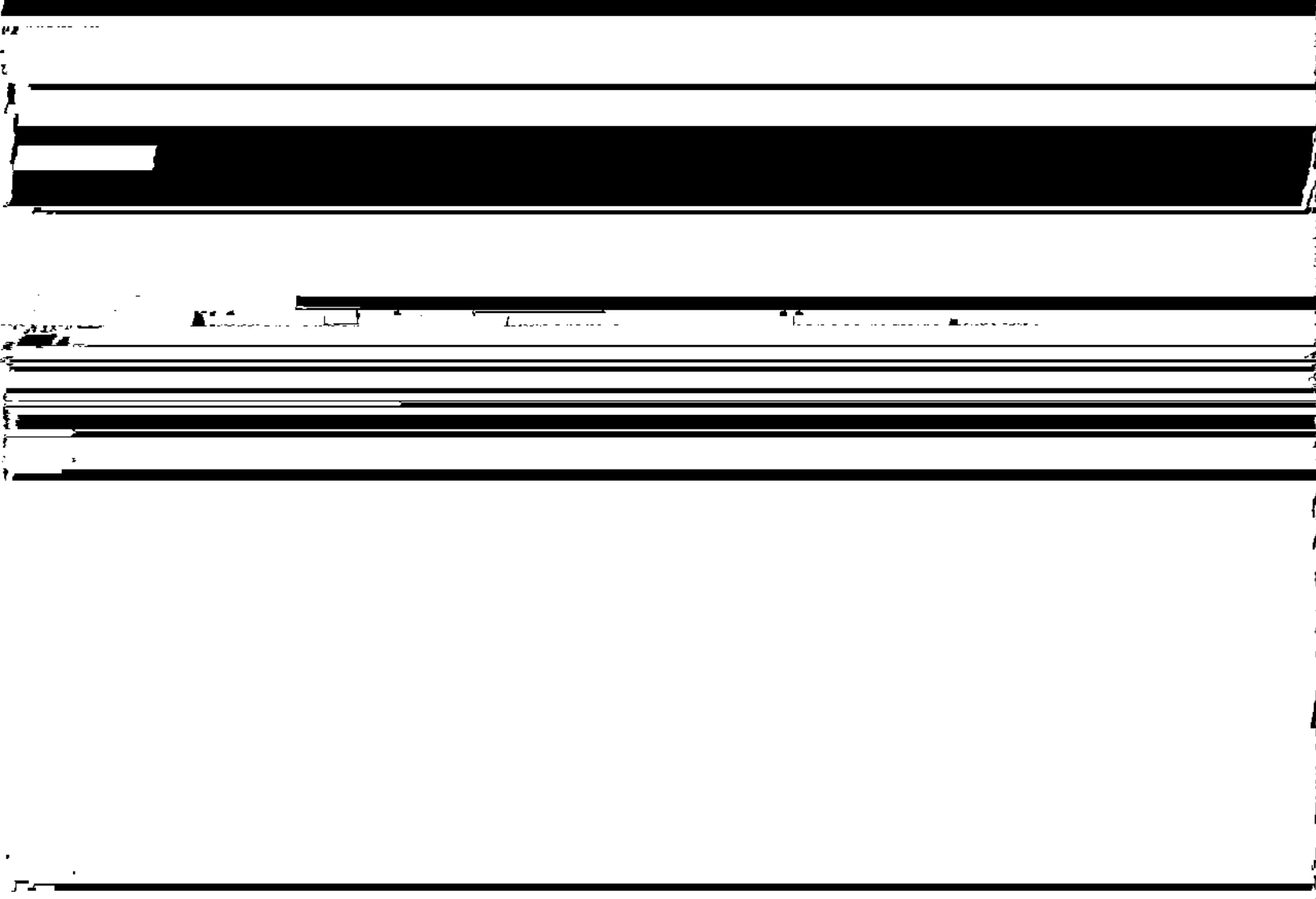

ANNEX B: INVENTORY AND PROCESSING TIME CONSIDERATIONS

Illustrative Examples of Multiyear Intake Scenarios (2023-2025) for all Options Presented

- Processing times for parent and grandparent applications are a result of intake management. If the **input** of applications received is greater than the **output** of finalized applications (based on admission targets), the inventory grows resulting in longer processing times. The current inventory of nearly 100,000 persons is sufficient to meet admission targets in the Multiyear Levels Plan for at least the next two years.

Maintaining a Processing Time Target

- While modernization efforts contribute to processing efficiency, a meaningful reduction and stability in processing times can only be achieved through intake management and the alignment of inputs with outputs.

Over the Department will have to align its intake to match its processing times for permanent and temporary resident applications.
